

#### Talk About It


One sheep sees something weird—tell the flock! Share stories of scam calls, fake texts, or suspicious emails. Make it normal to ask, "Does this seem right to you?"






## **Help Each Other**

Grandma might not know how to update her phone—but her grandkid does. Help family members turn on automatic updates, set up strong passwords, and use two-step login.




#### Learn
